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

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


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

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Instrument Security Room

Convention registrants are advised not to leave instruments unattended in hotel rooms and not to carry them (or any conspicuous valuables) outside the hotel unless absolutely necessary. Registrants are strongly advised to keep instruments out of sight.

A secure room with a 24-hour guard is located on the 2nd floor in room 216B in the Charlotte Convention Center. **The convention center is open only until mid-night each night.** The security room is available for checking instruments starting Wednesday, August 10, at noon and ending Sunday, August 14, at 11:00 p.m. Registrants may take instruments in or out as needed, 24 hours a day.

THIS SERVICE ENDS AT 11:00 P.M. SUNDAY, AUGUST 14, 2011.

Procedure for Checking Instruments

All convention registrants (i.e., convention attendees with badges) may use the instrument security room free of charge.

When you check your bag, you will be given a tag/receipt combination. On the tag, write your name as it appears on your badge and your room number at the hotel or a local number at which you can be reached. Each time you check your bag, the guard will hand you the receipt portion of this ticket. This will be for one case unless you open the case and request a receipt specifying contents of the case.

To claim your instrument, you must present your receipt and be wearing your badge; the name printed on the tag must match the badge of the person picking up the bag.

Since many flute cases look identical, it will be helpful to attach a unique identifying item (e.g. brightly colored scarf, pompom, toy key chain) to the case to enable the guards to find it more quickly.

We hope the knowledge that your instruments are secure will free you to enjoy the convention to the fullest.

All items not picked up by 11:00 p.m. on Sunday, August 14, 2011, will be turned over to the hotel for pick-up.

The hotel will not guarantee any security for items delivered to it!



arol Wincenc appears with orchestras worldwide and has premiered works written for her by prominent composers. In the 2009-2010 season, she celebrated her 40th anniversary as a performer with a three-concert series in New York featuring the premieres of six newly commissioned works by Joan Tower, Jake Heggie, Thea Musgrave, Shih-Hui Chen, Andrea Clearfield, and Jonathan Berger.

With the Detroit Symphony, Wincenc gave the world premiere of a flute concerto written for her by Pulitzer-Prize winner Christopher Rouse. Wincenc also gave the world premiere of Henryk Gorecki's

Concerto-Cantata at Amsterdam's Concertgebouw and the U.S. premiere with the Chicago Symphony. She is in demand for her interpretation of Lukas Foss's Renaissance Concerto for Flute and Orchestra, a work written for her, and has premiered concerti by Peter Schickele, Joan Tower, Paul Schoenfield, and Tobias Picker, who composed The Rain In the Trees, a double concerto for her and soprano Barbara Hendricks inspired by the rainforest poems of W.S. Merwin.

Recent appearances have included performances of Christopher Rouse's Flute Concerto with the Rockford Symphony (Illinois), the Santa Rosa Symphony (California), and ProMusica Columbus. In summer 2007, she received the Distinguished Alumni Award from the Brevard Music Center and inaugurated the new Barrere Flute Studio at the Chautauqua Institution with a solo recital.

Wincenc has appeared with the St. Louis, Atlanta, and Seattle symphonies; the Los Angeles and St. Paul Chamber orchestras; the Mostly Mozart, Santa Fe, Spoleto, Caramoor, Marlboro, Sarasota, and Music @ Menlo festivals; the London Symphony and English Chamber orchestras; and the Aldeburgh, Budapest, Tivoli, and Frankfurt international music festivals. She has collaborated with the Guarneri, Emerson, and Tokyo string quartets; sopranos Jessye Norman and Elly Ameling; pianist Emanuel Ax; and cellist Yo-Yo Ma. She is flutist with the New York Woodwind Quintet. She was nominated for a Grammy Award for the 2005 Naxos recording of works by Yehudi Wyner with Richard Stoltzman and other colleagues. Her recording of Christopher Rouse's Flute Concerto for Telarc with Christoph Eschenbach and the Houston Symphony won the Diapason d'Or.

Wincenc is a professor of flute at the Juilliard School of Music and Stony Brook University and has adjudicated the Walter W. Naumburg Chamber Music Competition and the Kobe International Flute Competition. Lauren Keiser Music

Publishers are releasing The Carol Wincenc 21st Century Series for Flute. The Carol Wincenc Signature Editions compilations are published by Carl Fischer.

Trevor Wye studied the flute privately with both Geoffrey Gilbert and the celebrated Marcel Moyse. He was a freelance orchestral and chamber music player on the London scene for many years and has made several solo recordings. He was formerly a professor at the Guildhall School of Music, London, and for 21 years at the Royal Northern College of Music in Manchester.

Trevor Wye is the author of the Practice Books for the flute, which have received world-wide acclaim having been translated into 11 other languages. His wrote a highly praised biography of



Marcel Moyse and in 2009 his book *Efficient Practice* was published in the U.S. His latest book, *Fantastic Flutes: 60 Things You Can Do with Flutes*, was published in 2011. He has made many flute group arrangements including a number of jazz pieces, especially for the groups Wye's Guys, Wye's Men, and the Japanese group, The Bluebelles.

During the winter, he teaches at his Flute Studio in Kent, a residential course for post-graduate students, and travels throughout the world including for annual appearances in the U.S., Europe, Taiwan, and Japan giving classes and concerts, including the *Carnival Show, 50 Variations on the Carnival of Venice for 60 Flutes and Piano.* He enjoys serving on juries for international competitions, always traveling in business class, having a fear of it being known that he crashed in economy.

He is the founder of the British Flute Society and possesses a current Class 'C' Explosives License, issued by the British Police, though these two facts are totally unrelated.

In 1990 he was made an honorary Fellow of the Royal Northern College of Music by the Duchess of Kent.

Katherine Borst Jones

Katherine Borst Jones has been professor of flute at The Ohio State University since 1985. She was awarded the 1995 Distinguished Teacher Award and the 2008 Scholar Award in the School of Music. She performers with the quintet Scarlet Winds and with the Jones/Norton flute and harp duo. She is a Visiting Professor at China's Shenyang Conservatory and cofounded and taught at the Robert Willoughby Master Classes at the University of New Hampshire. In 1976, she created the annual High School Flute Workshop program at Ohio State. She has taught at Heidelberg College, Denison University, Emporia

State University (Kansas), Oberlin Conservatory, and other instutions. Jones thanks teachers Keith Brion, Robert Willoughby, Kyril Magg, Donald McGinnis, and Julius Baker for their mentorship and inspiration.

As a life member of the NFA, she has been president twice; secretary/treasurer; assistant secretary; program chair for the 1992 convention; and chair of the longrange planning, advisory, and development commitees, and was in the delegation to the Soviet Union in 1989. She has adjudicated competitions and performed at NFA conventions. She conducted The Ohio State University Flute Troupe at four conventions: the first 2009 Collegiate Flute Choir, the 1997 National High School Flute Choir, and the convention flute choirs in 2000 and 2004. She also was a conductor for the Guinness Book of Records flute choir with James Galway in 2009 and has attended conventions since 1976. Board accomplishments during her tenure include revision of the constitution and by-laws, establishment of the Library of Congress archives, republishing Kincaidiana, and redirecting management of The Flutist Quarterly, the NFA's member magazine.

A founding member of Cosmos, a trio for flute, viola and harp, Borst Jones has commissioned and premiered works by Libby Larsen, Stephen Paulus, Andrew Boysen, Donald Harris, and Stephen Main. She has also commissioned works by Stephen Montague, Michael Ruszczynski, Mark DeVoto, Tom Duffy, Daniel Bukvich, and others. She has performed for George Crumb, Vincent Persichetti, Donald Harris, Larsen, William Bolcum, George Perle, John Corligiano, Bright Sheng, and Michael Daugherty and premiered works by Jean Françaix, Peter Schickele, Daugherty, and Dana Wilson. She is a founding member, soloist, and co-principal flutist of the ProMusica Chamber Orchestra of Columbus, former principal flute and soloist with the Columbus Bach Ensemble, member of the Columbus Symphony Orchestra, and principal flute of the New Sousa Band. She has recorded for CRI, d'Note, and Summit and published with Southern Music.

Grateful to colleagues and friends in the NFA, Kathy thanks them for the opportunities, friendships, and inspirations and considers it a privilege to serve the NFA.

Bo Guide to Convention Exhibits R

The exhibit hall is one of the highlights of all National Flute Association conventions. It is an ideal place to gather important information about flutes and flute-related products from around the world. At the exhibits, flutists, teachers, and students can find tools and ideas to help them carry out their daily work. The exhibiting companies have gone to considerable expense to present their products and services and to make themselves available to you.

Here are some suggestions that will help you get the most out of your time at the convention and in the exhibit hall:

- Study the convention program as soon as possible and decide which hours to allot for visiting the exhibits. Also, examine the exhibit listings and mark those that seem to be the most interesting for your area of playing and teaching.
- Before removing anything from an exhibit booth, be certain that it is complimentary material. Some companies make catalogs, circulars, and price lists available and others do not.
- Be aware that taking all of the free material offered to you may result in your leaving much of it behind in the hotel room because of weight or bulk. This is a waste of your time and the exhibitors' money. Exhibitors will be happy to send literature to you by mail upon request.
- Whenever possible, register for the mailing lists of the companies whose products you find interesting. If you are a teacher, you will find many companies will want your school address. If you are a student, it is best to leave your permanent home address; most companies avoid temporary college addresses.
- Get to know the representatives associated with the companies whose products are a vital part of your work. A point of personal contact may become helpful at some time in the future.
- Individuals who wish to place a single item for sale may do so through a personal ad on the For Sale bulletin board located in the registration area. You may not make sales or solicit sales in the exhibit hall if you are not a registered exhibitor.
- Organizations and commercial businesses may not use the bulletin board as a means of making contact with NFA members or other potential buyers.
- Enjoy the convention and the exhibit hall, and please spend time with as many exhibitors as possible. They will appreciate your patronage.

To protect instruments and other items on display, **no food or drink are permitted in the exhibit hall.** (Registered exhibitors are exempt from this policy.)



He is a member of Il Gardellino, the Dorian Consort, and the Stradivarius Soloists of the Berlin Philharmonic, and he is music director of Accademia Daniel and Oslo Baroque. 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ALEXANDRA AGUIRRE won the Great Southwest Flute Festival's chamber music competition as a member of Madera Winds. DIANNE AITKEN chairs the NFA New Music Advisory Committee, teaches at the Royal Conservatory, and is a senior member of the College of Examiners. Her publications include *Overtones* (Frederick Harris Music) and the RC Flute Syllabus. She balances performing, recording, teaching, curriculum, and family.

ROBERT AITKEN is a Canadian flutist and composer. After playing with the Vancouver Symphony, Aitken went on to pursue a highly successful solo career. He has more than 40 recordings to his name and was a recipient of the 2003 NFA Lifetime Achievement Award.

JAMES AKINS is principal tuba with the Columbus Symphony and professor of tuba at Ohio State. He taught the country's first Native American flute class at OSU, and he has performed with numerous orchestras on native flutes. He is a Native American flute maker, exhibiting them at many NFA conventions.

LORI AKINS is principal flute of the Springfield Symphony, and she plays flute and piccolo with the Columbus and Ohio Valley symphonies. She is on the faculty at Cedarville, Heidelberg, and Wittenberg universities. Akins previously served the NFA as secretary and general competitions coordinator.

ORIA ALEXANDER is a sophomore at Westfield High School in New Jersey, where she performs in the wind ensemble. She is also a member of the New Jersey Youth Symphony's Flute Forum, and she played bass flute in last year's NFA High School Flute Choir. She has studied with Jenny Cline for five years.

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
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


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
