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
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Security Room

Convention registrants are advised not to leave instruments unattended in their hotel rooms and not to carry them (or any conspicuous valuables) outside the hotel unless absolutely necessary. Registrants are strongly advised to keep instruments out of sight.

A secure room with a 24-hour guard is located in the Convention Center in Office 8 near Octavius Ballroom. The security room is available for checking instruments starting Wednesday, August 8, at noon and ending Sunday, August 12, at 11:00 p.m. Registrants may take instruments in or out as needed, 24 hours a day.

THIS SERVICE ENDS AT 11:00 P.M. SUNDAY, AUGUST 12, 2012.

Procedure for Checking Instruments

All convention registrants (i.e., convention attendees with badges) may use the instrument security room free of charge.

When you check your bag, you will be given a tag/receipt combination. On the tag, write your name as it appears on your badge and your room number at the hotel or a local number at which you can be reached. Each time you check your bag, the guard will hand you the receipt portion of this ticket. This will be for one case unless you open the case and request a receipt specifying the contents of the case.

To claim your instrument, you must present your receipt and be wearing your badge; the name printed on the tag must match the badge of the person picking up the bag.

Since many flute cases look identical, it will be helpful to attach a unique identifying item (e.g., brightly colored scarf, pom-pom, toy key chain) to the case to enable the guards to find it more quickly.

We hope the knowledge that your instruments are secure will free you to enjoy the convention to the fullest.

All items not picked up by 11:00 p.m. on Sunday, August 12, 2012, will be turned over to the hotel for pick-up.

The hotel will not guarantee any security for items delivered to it!

Rules and Policies



No Smoking

No smoking is allowed in any performance area, rehearsal room, or exhibit area. Please note venue regulations on smoking on and around convention premises.



No Photographs

No photographing is allowed in any scheduled concert or presentation (with or without flash and including cell phone cameras) except by official convention photographers. Photography is permitted in social and exhibit areas.

Recording Policy

Any audio or video recording of any convention concert or presentation without first obtaining any and all legally required permissions and licenses is strictly prohibited, unless the person making the recording or causing the recording to be made:

- a) has, prior to making the recording, obtained all legally required permissions and licenses from the copyright holders to make said recording and will obtain all legally required permissions and licenses from the copyright holders for each use that is made of said recording;
- b) has, prior to making the recording, obtained the written permission for the making of and for each anticipated use of said recording from all the performers or performer groups, presenters and/or other participants and/or participant groups involved in the recorded presentation and/or performance;
- c) will not block the view of any person in the audience, create noise, or otherwise interrupt, disturb, disrupt, or delay the performance or presentation being recorded;
- d) will, for each additional or subsequent use of said recording, obtain from each of the performers or performer groups, presenters, and other participants and/or participant groups involved in said recorded presentation and/or performance the written permission for any and each such additional or subsequent use; and
- e) will not use said recording for any copyright infringing or other illegal purpose or for any purpose that would be detrimental to the NFA.

Please note: In accordance with Caesars policy, video recording is prohibited without the consent of the hotel.

Please turn off cell phones and pagers before any performance or presentation.

In accordance with NFA policy, refrain from applause at all competition events.

Please observe policies out of courtesy to all the performers and attendees. These policies will be strictly enforced by convention management.

Rehearsals will take place in the performance halls between events. Please do not disturb them. Doors will open 15 minutes prior to the event.

Bonita Boyd

Born in Pittsburgh, Bonita Boyd grew up in Long Beach, California. Early teachers included Maurice Sharp of the Cleveland Orchestra, Roger Stevens of the Los Angeles Philharmonic, and Joseph Mariano, principal flutist of the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra and legendary pedagogue of the Eastman School of Music. Boyd succeeded Mariano in both posts, becoming the youngest person in the United States to hold major academic and orchestral appointments, as noted by Glamour Magazine in its "Outstanding Career Women of the Year" feature.

At age 21, Boyd was named principal flutist of the Rochester Philharmonic under Maestro David Zinman, a position she resigned in 1984 to devote herself to her growing solo career. Follow an acclaimed New York debut recital in 1980, Boyd later made her Los Angeles debut and solo tours of Europe and the Far East. She has performed throughout the world and as soloist with such orchestras as the National Gallery Orchestra, National Symphony Orchestra of the Dominican Republic, Chautauqua Symphony Orchestra, Chamber Orchestra of Philadelphia, Denver Chamber Orchestra, Buffalo Philharmonic, Busan Symphony Orchestra, Western Australia Symphony Orchestra, Queensland Symphony Orchestra, Polish Radio Orchestra, and Lithuanian Chamber Orchestra Vilnius. She served as principal flutist of the Rochester Philharmonic (1971–1984), Chautauqua Symphony (1971-1977), and Filarmónica de las Américas (Mexico City). She has been a member of the artist faculties of such festivals as the Chautauqua, Bowdoin, and Iohannesen Music Festivals and the Eastman Summer Seminar in Hamamatsu and has been guest artist at Eastern Music Festival, the MasterWorks Festival, Marlboro, and the National Orchestral Institute. She is an artist faculty member of the Aspen Music Festival and the Aria International Festival and co-principal flutist of the Aspen Festival Orchestra. She also is a Fulbright grant recipient.

Boyd has premiered and/or made the premiere recording of numerous works, including major solo and chamber works of Samuel Adler, Warren Benson, Miklós Rósza, Augusta Read Thomas, Eric Sessler, David Liptak, Leonard Bernstein, Roberto Sierra, and Katherine Hoover. Her recording Flute Music of Les Six was honored by Stereo Review in its 1983 Record of the Year Awards and her Paganini Caprices CD was on the final ballot for a Grammy nomination. She concertizes regularly with renowned guitarist Nicholas Goluses, and the duo has recently released its second CD, Quicksilver, on Albany.

Boyd has been awarded the Eisenhart Award for Excellence in Teaching by the Eastman School of Music, and her students occupy major orchestral and teaching posts throughout the world. She recently celebrated 35 years of teaching at Eastman with the return of many students for a great party! She was married to the late Christian Soderstrom, a Swedish engineer, and she has three sons.

Boyd has served as president, chair of the board, board member, and program chair for the National Flute Association.

Thanks to the Dust Bowl and the Great Depression, Betty Bang Mather lived in six houses in her native Emporia, Kansas, and attended high schools in Des Plaines, Illinois; South Orange, New Jersey; and Forest Hills (Queens), New York City. Her BMus is from the Oberlin Conservatory and her MA from Columbia Teachers College. Her flute teachers include H. Henry Zlotnik, Harry Peters (an oboist, as there was no flute teacher at Oberlin at the time), Arthur Lora, William Kincaid, Jean-Pierre Rampal, Gaston Crunelle, Gustav Scheck, and Roger Mather.



Betty Bang Mather

During her high school and college years she played with the New York All-City High School Orchestra, Tanglewood Music Center Orchestra, Oberlin Orchestra, Juilliard Summer Scholarship Orchestra, and National Orchestral Association.

From 1952 to 1996 Mather taught flute at the University of Iowa, one of the first universities to hire a full-time flute professor (Mather), to have an active faculty woodwind quintet, to offer a PhD in composition and a DMA in musical performance, to invite high-level guest composers to work with students, and to support a center for new music. In 1973, Mather married the British-born scientist and flute teacher Roger Mather. On the basis of Roger's flute clinics and his contract to write a book on flute playing, UI hired him part time and then as adjunct professor to share Betty's teaching load. This gave them both time to research and write. He concentrated on tone production and she on the music.

Mather has presented concerts, lecture/demonstrations, seminars, and workshops in the United States, France, Germany, England, Switzerland, China, Taiwan, and New Zealand. Her articles, editions, and books have been reprinted (and translated in many cases) in Japan, Germany, Australia, Argentina, Switzerland, New Zealand, and the Netherlands. Her presentations and publications deal with expanding the flute repertoire, Baroque and Classical preludes and cadenzas, Baroque performance practices, Baroque dance, holistic approaches to learning and performance, and the poetic orations in Bach's flute music.

Mather's editions include Freillon-Poncein and Hotteterre "le Romain" Preludes for Recorder (with David Lasocki), 30 Virtuosic Selections in the Gallant Style, 60 Favorite Airs in the Gallant Style, Three Opera Duets, The French Noel (with Gail Gavin), Bach's Partita for Solo Flute (with Elizabeth A. Sadilek), and Bach's B Minor Overture-Suite (with Dean M. Karns). Her books include Interpretation of French Music from 1675 to 1775, Free Ornamentation in Woodwind Music (with Lasocki), The Classical Woodwind Cadenza (with Lasocki), The Art of Preluding (with Lasocki), and Dance Rhythms of the French Baroque (with Karns).

Mather spoke and performed at the first NFA convention in 1973, served as coprogram chair for the second convention, served twice on the board of directors, and was the 15th president (and first woman elected to that position). She has presented convention sessions, written for *The Flutist Quarterly*, and served many years on the *The Flutist Quarterly*'s editorial advisory board.

Nancy Toff

Nancy Toff is one of the world's leading authorities on the history of the flute. She is the author of *The Development of the Modern Flute* (1979), *The Flute Book* (third edition, 2012), and *Monarch of the Flute: The Life of Georges Barrère* (2005) and was curator of the exhibition *Georges Barrère and the Flute in America* at the New York Public Library for the Performing Arts, for which she wrote the catalog (1994). For her work on Barrère she has received the Dena Epstein Award for Archival and Library Research in American Music from the Music Library Association and grants from the Sinfonia

Foundation and the American Musicological Society. She collaborated with flutist Leone Buyse to program and annotate two CDs containing music that was dedicated to Barrère and has contributed numerous articles to professional journals and reference books.

A frequent speaker at music, library, and history conferences and at universities nationwide, Toff has been a consultant to the Library of Congress and the Metropolitan Museum of Art. A past president of the New York Flute Club, she has served on its board of directors since 1986 and is also its archivist. She is a former secretary and member of the board of directors of the National Flute Association, is chair of its archives and oral history committee, and serves on its special publications and research committees and on the *Flutist Quarterly* editorial board.

Nancy Toff is vice president and executive editor at Oxford University Press, where she has edited such varied works as Langston Hughes's *The Sweet and Sour Animal Book*, whose unpublished manuscript she discovered, and Richard Taruskin's magisterial *Oxford History of Western Music*. She has also held editorial positions at Time-Life Books and Music, Vanguard Records, and Chelsea House Publications and has been on the editorial board for *The New Grove Dictionary of American Music*. A graduate of Harvard, she studied flute with Arthur Lora and James Pappoutsakis and was a member of the Westchester (NY) Philharmonic.

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
Historic Recordings Series, Volume 4 Historic Recordings of Maurice Sharp

So Guide to Convention Exhibits 🖎

The exhibit hall is one of the highlights of all National Flute Association conventions. It is an ideal place to gather important information about flutes and flute-related products from around the world. At the exhibits, flutists, teachers, and students can find tools and ideas to help them carry out their daily work. The exhibiting companies have gone to considerable expense to present their products and services and to make themselves available to you.

Here are some suggestions that will help you get the most out of your time at the convention and in the exhibit hall:


- Study the convention program as soon as possible and decide which hours to allot for visiting the exhibits. Also, examine the exhibit listings and mark those that seem to be the most interesting for your area of playing and teaching.
- Before removing anything from an exhibit booth, be certain that it is complimentary
 material. Some companies make catalogs, circulars, and price lists available and others
 do not.
- Be aware that taking all of the free material offered to you may result in your leaving much of it behind in the hotel room because of weight or bulk. This is a waste of your time and the exhibitors' money. Exhibitors will be happy to send literature to you by mail upon request.
- Whenever possible, register for the mailing lists of the companies whose products you
 find interesting. If you are a teacher, you will find many companies will want your school
 address. If you are a student, it is best to leave your permanent home address; most
 companies avoid temporary college addresses.
- Get to know the representatives associated with the companies whose products are a vital
 part of your work. A point of personal contact may become helpful at some time in
 the future.
- Individuals who wish to place a single item for sale may do so through a personal ad on
 the For Sale bulletin board located in the registration area. You may not make sales or
 solicit sales in the exhibit hall if you are not a registered exhibitor.
- Organizations and commercial businesses may not use the bulletin board as a means of making contact with NFA members or other potential buyers.
- Enjoy the convention and the exhibit hall, and please spend time with as many exhibitors as possible. They will appreciate your patronage.

To protect instruments and other items on display, **no food or drink are permitted in the exhibit hall.** (Registered exhibitors are exempt from this policy.)



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
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

LEIGHANN DAIHL freelances throughout the U.S. and Europe on traverso as both a soloist and a collaborator. She received a bachelor's degree in traverso from the Royal Conservatory of The Hague where she was a student of Wilbert Hazelzet, and a master's degree in traverso from Indiana University.

DANIEL **D**ALAROSSA is the founder of Global Choro Music. Born in São Paulo, Brazil, he studied transverse flute with the late Professor João Dias Carrasqueira. Dalarossa travels the world recording, playing, and promoting Choro Music and the play-along albums.

Composer Jean-Michel Damase (b. 1928) writes immediately accessible music in the French tradition. He favors chamber music, particularly for wind instruments. He won the Prix de Rome at the age of 19. His music is published by Billaudot. He is on the faculty of the École Normale de Musique de Paris.

Invited to Tunghai University in the early 1980s to initiate a wind program, MARK DANNENBRING has served in many capacities: director of wind ensemble, choreographer for operas, graduate academic adviser, and early music performance. He is the artist behind the development of the Grenaditte flute.

JUDY DIEZ D'AUX is on the faculty of Assisi Performing Arts (Italy) and Paramount Chamber Players (Tennessee). She attended Baylor and the University of Akron. Her teachers include Brooks de Wetter-Smith, Anne Whaley Laney, Helen Ann Shanley, and George Pope. She resides in Montreal, Quebec.

MARIO DAVIDOVSKY (b. 1934) is an Argentine-American composer, having emigrated in 1960 to the U.S. He is best known for his series of compositions entitled *Synchronisms*, which in live performance incorporate both acoustic instruments and electroacoustic sounds played from a tape.

JEFF DAVIS is one of the most in-demand jazz bassists in Las Vegas, playing everything from big band to shows to small group jazz. A few of his musical credits include performances with Pete Christlieb, Joe Williams, Joe Lano, Bernadette Peters, and Twyla Tharp's Sinatra: Dance with Me.

JONATHAN DAVIS plays regularly with the Los Angeles Philharmonic, the Pacific Symphony, the Hollywood Bowl Orchestra, and the San Diego Symphony. He is also an active studio recording artist. MM and DMA, Juilliard. Davis teaches at UCLA and UC Irvine.

BROOKS DE WETTER-SMITH performs widely in the U.S., Europe, Asia, the Middle East, and South America. He has 12 recordings and is the Hanes Distinguished Professor of flute at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. His teachers include Kujala, Pappoutsakis, Rampal, and Galway.

TILMANN DEHNHARD (b. 1968) is a German jazz saxophonist, flutist, and composer. His piece "Wake Up!" for piccolo and alarm clock was premiered at the Frankfurt Flute Festival in 2001.
