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
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FROM THE CONVENTION PROGRAM CHAIR

2019 LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD



Emerson DeFord has directed his career as a flutemaker with the lifelong philosophy that every instrument he creates, whether for a student or a professional, will carry the same quality of workmanship. Expertly skilled in all stages of production, DeFord has passed his knowledge along to many who continue with his legacy.

DeFord began his flutemaking career at the W.T. Armstrong Flute Company in Elkhart, Indiana, and quickly rose to the position of vice president of production in 1962. A few years later, he started the Heritage Division, where he mentored many flutemakers including Bickford Brannen, Jack Moore, Tom Green, John Yeater, and Larry

Earnhart. DeFord and Mark Thomas worked together to improve the quality and design of student flutes and to develop the complete flute family (including bass, alto, E-flat soprano, C, treble G, and B-flat flutes) and, later, a wood piccolo and professional C flute.

In 1969, DeFord began production of the DeFord Flute, a new student instrument that became popular in the United States, China, Germany, Japan, and Australia. He eventually sold his successful DeFord Flute brand and took on other projects, acquiring Instrument City Pad Company, the Almeida Flute Company, and Hardy piccolos.

In 1978, DeFord began making a new instrument line, the Emerson Flute. With the introduction of the Emerson Flute came one of his greatest innovations, the process of prefabricating the flute so that the production of high-quality student flutes could be more efficient.

DeFord shares his passion for music and building high-quality instruments with his family. His wife, Polly, has worked beside him for years, doing everything from running the machines to managing the pad shop. His son Dean worked for him as a flute mounter for many years and then at Gemeinhardt building piccolos. While three of his children (Mark, Steve, and Laura) found careers in other businesses, they all inherited his interest in music. His stepdaughters, Christine Bertrem and Sherry Lee, and Christine's son, Brian Bertrem, credit DeFord as an invaluable mentor in the business. Both Sherry and Brian learned the craft methodically, working in every department until they knew all aspects of building and repairing flutes.

One of DeFord's most important contributions to the flute world is his work with flutists who have been injured or have developed physical conditions preventing them from playing their beloved instruments. He created specially tailored headjoint and key adaptations, modifying the angles so that the flutists could continue to play comfortably. Friends and colleagues speak of his generous nature—sharing tools, supplies, and knowledge—and his willingness to be a resource for teachers and repair technicians.

DeFord continues working for his grandson, Brian, making headjoints and piccolos and repairing flutes at one of his two workbenches: one in his Florida home and one in Elkhart, Indiana. DeFord celebrates his 90th birthday this year, and we celebrate the achievements his generosity and teaching have contributed to today's flute industry.

2019 LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

Susan Milan, born in London to civil servants, has been called the Queen of the Flute. She has led an extremely successful career as a symphony musician, soloist, recording artist, chamber musician, and teacher. She was the first female principal flutist of both the London Symphony Orchestra and the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra, the first woman to serve as flute professor at the Royal College of Music, the first woman to chair the British Flute Society, and the first woman jurist for the Kuhlau Competition.

Milan performs and gives masterclasses in the United States, East Asia, and Europe. She can be heard regularly on BBC Radio and has recorded for the Chandos, Upbeat, Da Capo, Omega, Denon, Cala, and Metier labels.



Milan performs with numerous chamber ensembles, including the Instrumental Quintet of London, the Debussy Ensemble, Barocco, and the Milan Trio. The Debussy Ensemble released a recording of Debussy, Bax, Mathias, and Ravel in 2011.

Milan has researched, written, and published books and sheet music widely, including 19th-century repertoire (Boosey & Hawkes), Wilhelm Popp's Sonatine Op. 388 (Spartan Press Edition), study books, and cadenzas. She is currently restoring and processing for CD her collection of historic 78 rpm recordings of flutists performing from 1910 to 1945.

Milan is committed to commissioning and performing new works and has had works written for her by numerous composers. Her recital CD, British Living Composers, with pianist Andrew Ball, was released in 2008.

Milan is director and founder of the British Isles Music Festival, where outstanding young musicians explore and perform chamber music under the direction of established performers and teachers. She is a professor and fellow of the Royal College of Music and professor of the Royal Northern College of Music and Trinitylaban Conservatory.

Convention registrants are advised not to leave instruments unattended in their hotel rooms and not to carry them (or any conspicuous valuables) outside the hotel unless absolutely necessary.

A secure room with 24-hour access is located in Room 150G (lower level) of the the Salt Palace Convention Center. The security room is available for checking instruments starting Wednesday, July 31, at 3:00 p.m. and ending Sunday, August 4, at 11:00 p.m. Registrants may take instruments in or out as needed, 24 hours a day. All instruments must be picked up by 11:00 p.m. Sunday August 4.

PROCEDURE FOR CHECKING INSTRUMENTS

All registered convention attendees may use the instrument security room free of charge.

When you check your bag, you will be given a tag/receipt combination. On the tag, write your name as it appears on your badge and your room number at the hotel or a number at which you can be reached. Each time you check your bag, the guard will hand you the receipt portion of this ticket. This will be for one case unless you open the case and request a receipt specifying the contents of the case.

To claim your instrument, you must present your receipt and be wearing your convention badge; the name printed on the tag must match the badge of the person picking up the bag and you must have a picture ID.

Since many flute cases look identical, it will be helpful to attach to the case an identifying item (e.g., brightly colored scarf, pom-pom, toy key chain) to help the guards find your case more quickly.

We hope the knowledge that your instruments are secure will free you to enjoy the convention to the fullest.

All items not picked up by 11:00 p.m. on Sunday, August 4, 2019, will be turned over to the Convention Center Security Area for pickup. Contact information for Security Area is 385-468-2220.

The hotel will not guarantee security for any items delivered to the security area.

LOST AND FOUND

Items found may be given to the NFA Information Desk. At the conclusion of the Information Desk hours each day, found items will be given to the Salt Palace Convention Center Lost and Found. Contact information for the Security Area is 385-468-2220.

In accordance with NFA policy, refrain from applause at all competition events.

Please observe policies as a courtesy to all the performers and attendees.

Rehearsals will take place in the performance halls between events. Please do not disturb them. Doors will open 15 minutes prior to the event.
